## **QUESTIONS**

- \*Numbers in parentheses are those used in the DESE Chart of Accounts
- 1) Health Insurance: What is the current district or town-employee split for health insurance costs (5200) and for retirees (5250)? (Acton-Boxborough's is 75%/25% for current employees and 50%/50% for retirees).
- 2) Teachers: What type of early retirement incentive (if any) does your district offer to encourage veteran teachers to retire early?
- 3) Administrative/Operational: We are looking at staffing at the district and building-levels and are wondering if you have organizational charts for your central office and schools that you can share. We are interested in positions included under the following categories reported to DESE:
  - i) School Building Leadership (2200), which includes curriculum leaders, department heads, school principals & assistants, headmasters and deans.
  - ii) Specialist teachers (2310), instructional coordinators (2315), professional development leaders (2351), paraprofessionals & teaching assistants (2330).
  - iii) District level administration (1000 & 2100) including curriculum directors (2110) and dept. heads (2120).
- 4) Transportation: We are looking at our district's costs for transporting students both indistrict (to-and-from school) and out-of-district.
  - i) For in-district transportation (3300), do you own or lease your bus fleet? Are leasing arrangements reviewed periodically? Do you charge families a fee for in-district transportation?
  - ii) For out-of-district transportation: How does your district transport students attending out-of-district schools? (We use mainly CASE Collaborative transportation and some private.) If you use collaborative-provided transport, how many students used it in FY15, and how much was spent? Do you have access to a fee schedule? Is there a process to ensure OOD transportation contracts are fair and reasonable, e.g., does your district bid out or consider other transportation costs? Is there useful data on FY16 spending available?
- 5) Athletics (3510) & Other Student Activities (3520): Though only about 1% of our total budget, fees for athletics and extra-curriculars such as music, theater, etc., tend to hit family pocketbooks pretty hard. We are troubled by the variability of the income streams upon which these programs depend (user fees keep going up). What was the total operating cost of your athletics program in FY15? What percentage of this budget was funded by (1) user fees, (2) gate receipts, (3) donations and (4) appropriated budget? (We were 31%, 4%, 4% and 61%, respectively.) Do you have similar data (% funded by fees v. appropriated budget) for Other Student Activities?
